GLOSSY MAGAZINE RECYCLING PROGRAM for Ronald McDonald House.

We have restarted this program and are actively collecting glossy magazines. You will find a black bin under the coat racks to place your magazines.



Why do we do this?

To help each other and the environment.

When the containers are full, Ronald McDonald House calls Consolidated Scrap Resources, Inc. to pick up the containers. They process the contents and sell them to a paper mill, which turns the discarded paper into new magazine paper. A portion of the proceeds from each ton of paper collected comes directly to RMHC-CP. Since this program began in 2004, over \$371,000 has been raised by recycling over 14,000 tons of glossy paper.

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE: U.S. WILDFIRES

"I keep the Lord always before me; because [the Lord] is at my right hand, I shall not be moved" (Psalm 16:8).

The 2021 wildfire season is devastating the western United States. A prolonged drought and extreme heat waves are causing wildfires to spread rapidly, which makes them difficult to contain. California is currently the hardest-hit state — the Dixie Fire, in Northern California, is already the second largest wildfire in the state's history, having burned over 505,000 acres. Tens of thousands of people are under evacuation orders, and hundreds of buildings have been destroyed.

The fires are not limited to California; more than 100 wildfires are now burning throughout 15 states. Smoke from these fires is carried across the country, a sign of the farreaching effects of worsening wildfires.

Lutheran Disaster Response is working with synods and social ministry organizations in California and other western states to develop a coordinated response to the wildfires. We anticipate that immediate needs will include food and other necessities. Long-term recovery will likely take years. Because emotional and spiritual care is a key aspect of disaster response, the Sierra Pacific Synod is developing a Lutheran Chaplaincy Corps, training rostered leaders and laypeople to offer such care to first responders and survivors after a disaster.

Your gifts will support wildfire survivors. Gifts to "U.S. Wildfires" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by wildfires, until the response is complete. Make your check out to Bern Lutheran Church, place it in your offering envelope and designate the amount you want to give to Lutheran Disaster Response Fires on your envelope.

You may also designate gifts to simply "<u>Lutheran Disaster</u> <u>Response</u>" so we can immediately respond to disasters in the United States and around the world whenever they might strike (including Haiti).

We pray that God may comfort and protect those in the paths of wildfires. Together, we can follow Christ's call to heal and share hope with those who are suffering.

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.



What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:

- 1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
- 2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
- 3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
 - blue = the Father
 - white = God's holiness
 - **gold** = God's kingdom
 - **green** = the earth
 - yellow = wheat (bread)
 - red = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
 - black = temptation
 - **orange** = God's power to deliver
