UPDATE ON NEW PASTOR CALL

This is just an update to keep everyone informed of the progress of the new pastor call process. The Congregational Vitality Survey answers have been entered into the synod website and a report was generated from your responses. Another step in the process was to complete a Ministry Site Profile (MSP). An MSP is a description of Bern Lutheran Church and the qualities we are looking for in a pastor; it is designed to serve as the first impression that we wish to give to prospective candidates. This was completed and uploaded to the ELCA website on May 25 and reviewed and approved by the synodical bishop for posting to the ELCA's Mobility Database System (MDS). Bern's Ministry Site Profile can be found at www.ELCA.org/Call-Process/Current-Openings. The information from the submitted MSP is stored in the MDS where prospective candidates can view ministry opportunities on the online bulletin board. And finally, your answers to the **Reflection Questions** have been submitted to the Associate of the Bishop, Pastor Rachael Dietz, who will forward them to the synod office for transcribing and collating for inclusion in the Parish Study Report (PSR). The PSR is generated from the three items in **bold** listed above. As we await the compilation of the PSR, we are now looking for members of Bern to volunteer their time as a member of the Call Committee.



As we continue with the process of calling a new pastor to Bern Lutheran Church, we are now looking for members of the congregation to form a Call Committee. A Call Committee usually consists of six voting members of the congregation. The purpose of the Call Committee is to represent the congregation in the process of finding and selecting a pastoral candidate.




- Play sand


